## Home-School Agreement

At St Thomas' we want to do everything possible to support you and your child so that they are successful and do their very best learning.

Here are some things that you can do to help your child and the school:

- See that your child comes to school every day on time at 8.55am
- Contact the school before the start of the day if your child is going to be absent - 0208 969 2810 or [info@st.rbkc.sch.uk](mailto:info@st.rbkc.sch.uk)
- Inform the school if your contact details change
- Ensure that your child brings the correct resources such as a book bag, PE kit
- Ensure your child wears full uniform and looks smart for school
- Ensure that your child's property is labelled and all uniform is labelled
- Read school communications - the newsletter comes out every Friday
- Inform us about any concerns or problems that might affect your child's learning or behaviour
- Support the school's policies and guidelines for behaviour
- Support your child's home-learning by doing a little bit of work each day eg; reading, recalling numbers and number bonds etc
- Ensure that homework is completed and returned to school by the due date
- Attend the termly pupil progress meetings to discuss your child's learning
- Take an active involvement in the life of the school eg; by attending school services at church, coffee mornings, curriculum meetings and social events
- Treat illnesses such as ringworm and nits and inform the school so that infections do not spread

We will support you and your child by:

- Contacting you if there is a problem such as illness/injury or behaviour
- Keeping you informed about school activities through regular letters home and notices about special events
- Giving you a week's notice of trips and visits so you can plan meals etc
- Monitoring the progress of your child's learning and provide feedback to you
- Sending home short termly reports to you about your child's progress
- Arranging meetings with you each term to discuss your child's progress
